The response from authors to the call exceeded our expectations, a sign of the importance of the subject and the correctness of its choice. On behalf of Oculum and PUC Campinas, I thank Professor Alejandro for generously accepting the challenge of actively participating in this construction!

In the next semester, new associate editors will be announced. This strategy reinforces to the public the understanding that Oculum considers collaboration an essential element for maintaining the quality of the journal, as important as the content published.

Finally, two acknowledgments. First, to the Editorial Board of the journal, as their support is vital for the good results we continue to achieve in terms of recognition and demand by both experienced researchers and the new generations.
